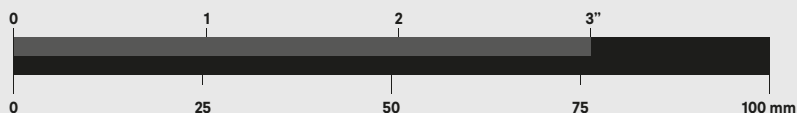

CALIBRATION SCALE



Ring measurements are very precise

To obtain an accurate measurement:

1. Prior to printing, ensure that Page Scaling is set to "None" or "100%" on your print dialog box.
2. Measure the calibration bar. It must be **exactly 100 mm (black) or 3 inches (grey) long.**

Measure your existing ring

1. Choose a ring that fits the finger that will be showing off your new Montluc eye-catcher.
2. Match the inside edge of your ring to one of the circles above. This is the **inside diameter**.
3. If your ring falls between sizes, go for the larger one.

Measure your finger

Your ring should feel comfortable, not too loose to risk falling off but not too tight either. Remember that the size of your finger can alter depending on the weather and even the time of day.

To get it right:

1. Did you know that your fingers are smaller first thing in the morning and also when they're cold? So **measure at the end of the day** and **make sure your fingers are warm**.
2. Measure 3 – 4 times to make sure. Don't use string or paper, both of which can stretch or twist resulting in inaccurate measurements.

Surprising someone special?

Two tips for getting it right first time.

1. Discreetly borrow an existing ring she already wears on the intended finger, then use the chart above.
2. Simply ask a close friend or even her mother... but swear them to secrecy first.
